The annual Awards of Excellence ceremony was held on June 7, 2023 at the Savannah African Art Museum. The Board created a new award to honor extraordinary museum and cultural leaders in our community.

Reciprocal Admission (RA) Program

39 museum members/sites participated in the RA program for the 2022-2023 membership year.

The CMA Board conducted a membership survey to determine if a printed or electronic RA card was preferable. In response to membership input, the Board shifted to a hard plastic reusable card. The cards feature a QR code/URL directing users to the RA program website (http://coastalmuseums.org/ra/) where current participants are listed. The cards are designed to be reused each year with a renewal sticker provided to renewed members/participants each November to update them. It is hoped that the first printing of cards will last 5 years before a new run needs to be printed.

Kiah Fund

Membership approved an increase of the maximum Kiah Fund Grant award from \$300.00 to \$500.00 in response to increasing professional development costs.

Membership approved a 15% annual allocation from the regular funds to the Kiah Fund, providing \$1,046.27 to replenish the Kiah Fund.

Membership approved two Kiah Fund Grant requests:

- Alison Beckelhymer, Museum Guide at the Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace, to attend Indiana University's Archives Management Certification Program, \$500.00
- Anne-Solene Bayan, Assistant Curator at Telfair Museums, to support attendance at the AAMC Art Curators Conference, \$500.00

A Kiah Fund Committee was established to develop a proposal to utilize the Kiah Fund to support an opportunity for high school and/or college students interested in the museum/cultural field. Laura Seifert, Fort



Pulaski National Monument, chaired the committee which resulted in membership approval of the Kiah Fund Guidelines being updated so that student members are now eligible to receive Kiah Fund Grants for internships and projects at Institutional Member sites.

Sustainability Committee

A special committee was formed to look at various aspects of CMA's operations to suggest improvements to strengthen the organization's sustainability and longevity. To assist the committee with their work, a membership survey was sent out to get a better understanding of our membership body and their needs. The committee's recommendations resulted in membership approval of the following:

- Student Membership level added
- Individual Members given the right to vote (Institutional members votes weighted 3 to 1 against Individual Member votes)
- Membership Dues increased
- One-year pilot membership incentive program for the 2023-2024 membership campaign
- Membership campaign begins on June 1st with a hard cut off of September 15th
- Membership Committee focuses on outreach to potential and lapsed members
- Online payment option for membership dues improved
- Membership renewal form simplified
- Online payments accepted for lunch orders
- Meeting schedule adjusted to offer year-round programming that rotates between lunch meetings with speakers, special events, afterwork networking events, and virtual meetings with speakers

The By-Laws have been updated as needed, and the Board updated the Membership Campaign processes for rollout in June for the 2023-2024 campaign. The Vice President and Programming Committee are working on developing a meeting/program schedule for the 2023-2024 year that addresses the new meeting schedule.

Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee, chaired by Robin Gunn, Ossabaw Island Foundation, prepared the slate of incoming officers, which was approved by the membership. Anne-Solene Bayan, Telfair Museums, will succeed Billie Stultz as Secretary. Adam Cusick, American Prohibition Museum, will succeed Juliana Sims, American Prohibition Museum, as Treasurer.



Annual Report - Tara Kelsey, Vice President Coastal Museums Association May 31, 2023

I appreciate everyone's patience with cleaning up the List Serv for 2022-23. We purged about 30 non-active emails. To date, we have **183 registered emails in the list serv**. It will be cleaned up again at the end of the 2022-23 membership campaign to reflect active membership at that time.

Our scheduled programs for 2022-23 included programs on: Volunteer Coordination, Social Media Strategies, the state of the Film Industry in Savannah, and museums as sites of change. Our annual SHER program was conducted by a representative of Homeland Security. We hosted two socials, our annual Member Showcase, and were given a special research presentation by an emerging museum professional in our community. We averaged 15-20 attendees for each daytime meeting/program and well over 30 for our evening socials.

We slowly worked on our RSVP system for meetings. Our biggest issue of the year was reservations for lunches that were never paid for by the absent attendee. Treasurer Juliana Sims solved this issue by finding an online payment solution.
