Member Introductions

Members were asked to introduce themselves, their affiliation, and whether they were new to CMA.

Approval of Minutes

Luciana Spracher, President of CMA, pointed out that CMA has gone "paperless," meaning there would be no printed agenda or copy of the minutes at the business meetings. A copy of the minutes was shared ahead of time via email. There was one small edit to the May minutes caught ahead of time (it said the location was Massie Heritage Center but it was Mickve Israel).

A motion to approve the minutes with that edit was given by Robin Gunn and seconded by Kathryn White. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Adam Cusick, CMA Treasurer, outlined the treasurer's report, noting that CMA started with \$8617,77 on May 3, 2023 and ended with \$9924.45 on October 4, 2023.

Luciana Spracher explained there would not be a vote for this item; the report is accepted as information.

Old Business

Elizabeth DuBose from the Ossabaw Island Foundation received the Award of Excellence. Luciana Spracher gave an overview of Elizabeth's work as Executive Director of the Foundation since 1998. Her efforts have included the restoration of 12 historic buildings on the island and three 19th century slave tabbies for which the Foundation received a preservation award from the Historic Savannah Foundation and the Georgia Trust. During Elizabeth's tenure, the Foundation increased annual visitation from 500 to 3,000 visitors. In 2020, when state legislation HB 906 threatened the Heritage Preserve protections across Georgia, including Ossabaw, Elizabeth rallied statewide opposition to the bill, including reaching out to President Jimmy Carter. As a result of her work, HB 906 died in a committee in the state Senate, assuring that all 336,000 acres of Heritage Preserve lands across Georgia at 120 sites would remain protected from resale and development. Since 2020, Elizabeth has served on the steering committee for the Save Butler Island Coalition, which is working to preserve, protect, and interpret the site from which families of enslaved people were deported and sold in 1859 during the Weeping Time sale in Savannah.

Membership Campaign Update

There are 20 individual members. They are historians, museum owners, museum professionals, museum volunteers, objects conservators, and preservation consultants. When asked why they joined, the following was stated as reasons: To develop and maintain professional relationships; To network, discuss, and share; To help support local arts and culture, local museums, and community organizations.

There is a new category for students. Currently, there are 11 student members from Georgia Southern and Savannah College of Art and Design.

Luciana Spracher outlined membership resources, including:

The Kiah Fund, which is available for professional development and knowledge sharing. If you are interested in applying, please make sure you explain how your use of the Kiah Fund would benefit CMA more broadly. There is now a student member category with specific guidelines on partnering with institutions. Applicants are encouraged to carefully review the guidelines.

The Listserv, which is managed by Tara Kelsey, CMA Vice President, is useful for sharing information about your sites, exhibitions, programs, closures, emergency situations, and sharing educational opportunities. CMA members will receive an email at the end of the week about how to post to the listserv.

The Reciprocal Admission (RA) program provides opportunities for active CMA members to visit member sites. There have been questions about RA cards (and renewal stickers), which will be distributed in November with program information discussed at the November business meeting. The cards will go out in the mail after the meeting to the mailing address you provided on your membership form. Please be aware that CMA recently switched to reusable cards that should be good for 5 years. Student members do not get cards.
